Guest of Honour country Spain: spilling creativity and royal glitz at the Frankfurter Buchmesse

The Guest of Honour pavilion offers books, encounters and interactive experiences Irene Vallejo and Antonio Muñoz Molina head up the delegation of around 100 Spanish authors in Frankfurt

The Spanish royal couple attend the opening of the Frankfurter Buchmesse

Frankfurt. The opening ceremony for this year's Frankfurter Buchmesse will be a truly grand occasion with the Spanish royal couple and the German president Frank-Walter Steinmeier in attendance. This also marks the kick-off for the Guest of Honour Spain, which will be presenting the full spectrum of its literary creations under the motto "Spilling creativity" from 19 October. Over 180 people will be coming to Germany as part of the Guest of Honour delegation, including some 100 Spanish authors who will be presenting their books in person in Frankfurt and other cities – first and foremost Irene Vallejo and Antonio Muñoz Molina, the literary keynote speakers at the opening of the book fair. No less than 50 events at the Frankfurter Buchmesse will portray a comprehensive picture of the dynamic Spanish book scene, which is characterised by a diversity of regional languages, each of which having its own literature. The centrepiece of the Guest of Honour's appearance is the colourful Guest of Honour pavilion on the grounds of the trade fair. Here, visitors can enjoy exciting encounters with Spain's best-known authors, discover new literary voices and witness musical and theatrical performances by Spanish artists.

"Thirty-one years have passed since the last time we were Guest of Honour at this book fair. In that time we have changed, both as a society and as a democracy. Our literature, in all its diversity and plurality, is the best expression of this." confirms **Miquel Iceta, Spain's Minister for Culture and Sport. Juergen Boos, Director of the Frankfurter Buchmesse,** is also looking forward to Spain taking its place as the Guest of Honour with its multiple literary and linguistic facets: "The multilingual aspect of the country plays an important role here. Alongside Castilian, a quarter of the authors who are coming to Frankfurt write in Catalan, Galician or Basque. And the book fair





will also bring together authors like Cristina Morales, Elvira Sastre, Esther Paniagua and Elena Medel – strong female voices who address key current topics."

A first-class programme in the Guest of Honour pavilion

Stories are like cherries. When you pull on one, the next one comes with it. This theory, expounded by the Spanish author Carmen Martín Gaite, is being embraced by Spain with its interactive Guest of Honour pavilion, designed by the Madrid-based architecture and design firm ENORME Studio, together with the design teams Vitamin and TwoPoints.Net. In three 'capsules' which esemble cherries, AI technology enables visitors to play their own role in Spanish creativity as they immerse themselves in Spain's literary scene, meet world-famous stars such as Rosa Montero, Arturo Pérez-**Reverte** and **Fernando Aramburu**, iconic authors like **Kiko Amat** and exciting new storytellers like Elena Medel, Miqui Otero and Ray Loriga. Big names like Almudena Grandes, who died last year, the recently deceased Javier Marías and Carlos Ruiz Zafón will be honoured with tributes. At the Books on Spain exhibition, publishing houses from around the world will be presenting their latest publications on Spain, and in German-language bookshops, the shelves will be filled with new Spanish works. With more than 400 new publications having come onto the German-language market since the start of the project in 2019, the Guest of Honour covers the full spectrum from fiction and poetry to non-fiction, as well as books for children and young people, comics and graphic novels. This year alone, 152 new books in German have been published. "We want to celebrate the creativity of our authors and all those who work in the book trade. Over the course of five days, more than 180 people will be involved in a series of literary discussions and encounters with experts in order to demonstrate the vitality of our cultural and publishing scene and to communicate the values and concerns of modern-day Spanish society," explains Elvira Marco, project director or Spain's participation as Guest of Honour at the Frankfurter Buchmesse 2022.

On discrimination and a rural exodus: new books from Spain

Having assumed the mantle of Guest of Honour for the first time in 1991, Spain is presenting itself anew in 2022, with its new publications addressing current socio-political topics. **Sergio Del Molino's** much discussed essay *La España vacía* highlights the complex consequences of the rural exodus in Spain. Young Spanish authors with a migrant background such as **Paloma Chen** and **Mohamed El Morabet** write about a





sense of rootlessness and the search for an identity. In her book *El lunes nos querrán*, **Najat El Hachmi** takes a stance against radical Islam and discrimination. Strong women are, in fact, a dominant feature of the Spanish literary scene. **Irene Vallejo** with her internationally successful *Papyrus* and **Sara Mesa** will be in Frankfurt, as will the celebrated poet and poetry slammer **Elvira Sastre**. **Cristina Morales** and **Elizabeth Duval** give a literary voice to all those who are labelled 'alternative' or 'different', while the illustrator **María Hesse** will present her new book on female sexuality.

Readings, exhibitions and performances

Spanish authors have been presenting their new books at readings, in panel discussions and at well-known literary festivals in the German-speaking part of Europe since spring 2022. During the Frankfurter Buchmesse, the entire city will host a diverse cultural programme. For example, Spanish authors will be the daily guests at the traditional **Open Books** reading festival between 18 and 22 October, while the **Instituto Cervantes** and the **Romanfabrik** invite the public to readings by authors from the Guest of Honour country. The tour will also continue once the Frankfurter Buchmesse has closed its doors: nine authors feature on the programme of the **Literaturtage Zofingen** (Switzerland) from 28 to 30 October, where Spain is also the Guest of Honour. Exhibitions at the **Frankfurter Kunstverein** (*Where will we go from here? Twelve art stories told from Spain*), the **Fotografie Forum Frankfurt** (*Pérez Siquier*), and **Goetheplatz** (50 *Photographs with a Story*) are dedicated to Spanish photography, and a performance by Esther Ferrer can be seen at the **Opelvillen Rüsselsheim**.

Guest speakers at the opening of the Frankfurter Buchmesse 2022

Irene Vallejo



Born in 1979 in Zaragoza, Irene Vallejo studied classical philology at the universities of Zaragoza and Florence. During this time, she discovered her passion for Antiquity. Papyrus, her first work of nonfiction, became a bestseller in Spain and has been awarded Spain's most renowned literary prizes. She also reports on her passion for Antiquity in her many appearances as a guest speaker and in weekly columns in the daily newspapers El País Semanal and Heraldo de Aragón. Irene Vallejo is the author of two novels and a number of children's books. She lives with her family in Zaragoza.

Antonio Muñoz Molina



Antonio Muñoz Molina, born in 1956 in Úbeda, Andalusia, is considered one of the most important contemporary Spanish authors and has had more than a dozen novels published, including In the Night of Time (2016), Like a Fading Shadow (2017) and To Walk Alone in the Crowd (2022). His works of fiction have won many prizes, including the Spanish National Prize for Literature on two separate occasions. In 1995, he was elected to the Royal Spanish Academy (RAE) and in 2019, was appointed to the board of the Prado

Museum. Muñoz Molina lives in Madrid and Lisbon.

Spilling creativity page after page: experience Spain's literature in Frankfurt

100 Spanish authors are coming to Frankfurt Tributes to Almudena Grandes, Javier Marías and Carlos Ruiz Zafón Readings also being staged in Frankfurt, Cologne and Berlin

Frankfurt. The Spanish literary scene is noted for its inventiveness, captured in the "Spilling creativity" slogan with which Spain will present itself as the Guest of Honour at the Frankfurter Buchmesse, running from 19 to 23 October and comprising more than 50 events. The Spanish delegation includes around 100 Spanish authors, among them well-known representatives of their craft such as **Elvira Sastre, Irene Vallejo** and **Fernando Aramburu, Sara Mesa, Javier Cercas** and **Ray Loriga**. The great Spanish writers **Almudena Grandes, Carlos Ruiz Zafón** and the recently deceased **Javier Marías** will be celebrated with tributes. There will also be exciting literary encounters with Spanish authors in Frankfurt, Berlin, Bonn and other cities throughout October.

On identities, illusions and the real-estate boom

The Guest of Honour will present the full spectrum of its literary creations and its diversity of language in readings, book presentations and panel discussions with world-famous authors such as **Rosa Montero** (22 October, 11 a.m.), **Arturo Pérez-Reverte** (20 October, 2 p.m.), **Enrique Vila-Matas** (20 October, 12 p.m.) and **Antonio Muñoz Molina**, who will be talking on 'Beyond the Boundaries of Imagination'(19 October 4 p.m.). The programme in the Guest of Honour pavilion will address current socio-political topics: **Paloma Chen, Mohamed El Morabe, Nadia Hafid** and **Margarita Yakovenko** are the first generation of Spanish authors with an immigrant background and they will address topics such as family, rootlessness and the search for an identity (21 October, 10 a.m.). The two highly successful young authors **Elizabeth Duval** and **Cristina Morales** will talk about 'Love, Desire and Pain' in literature and give a voice to all those who feel they are seen as 'alternative' or 'different' by mainstream society (23 October, 2 p.m.). **Sara Mesa, Patricio Pron** and **Isaac Rosa** write about romantic relationships that are thwarted by work or money, about illusions and precariousness, power and politics. They will discuss the relationship between society and literature





(19 October, 2 p.m.), while **Sergio del Molino** and **Jorge Dioni López** paint an impressive portrait of a country caught between a rural exodus and a real-estate boom (20 October, 10 a.m.).

Between the past and the future

Simultaneously fragile and unpredictable, nature is an important theme in contemporary Spanish literature – **Anna Ballbona**, **Jesús Carrasco** and **María Sánchez** discuss how nature speaks to us (20 October, 4 p.m.). How literature creates a shared collective memory and the relationships that arise between the past and literary tales are the topics of discussion for the best-selling authors **Javier Cercas**, **Daniel Gascón** and **José Carlos Llop** (19 October, 1 p.m.). What kind of future do we want to create? This is the question that Spanish philosophers **Marina Garcés**, **César Rendueles** and **Daniel Innerarity** are asking in view of a world in a permanent state of crisis (21 October, 4 p.m.).

Panel discussions, music and staged readings

In the Guest of Honour pavilion, trade visitors can get a deeper insight into the Spanish book industry: Spanish publishers outline the current challenges faced by independent publishers (19 October, 2 p.m.), while representatives from the book trade talk about the opportunities for bookshops in the digital era (20 October, 2 p.m.). Spanish sounds are brought to the Guest of Honour pavilion by the composer and pianist **Sheila Blanco**, singer **Silvia Pérez Cruz** and flamenco guitarist **Fraskito** with his homage to the Spanish poet Miguel Hernández, while the programme is rounded off by dramatised readings from plays by **Chaves Nogales** and **María Velasco**.

Spain in Frankfurt...

Both in the run-up to and during the book fair, the city of Frankfurt will also be celebrating the "spilling creativity" of Spain. For example, the Instituto Cervantes **Frankfurt** will be putting on a diverse programme of events in association with various partners. The Romanfabrik will be the venue for an encounter with the poet and poetry slammer **Elvira Sastre** on 21 October, when she will present her début novel *Días sin ti*. On 19 October **Rosa Ribas**, **José Ovejero** and **Isaac Rosa** will discuss 'Life in the Sign of the Precariat' with the executive board of IG Metall in the Main Forum. And **Leire Bilbao**, **Maite Mutuberria**, **Elia Barceló**, **Aina Bestard Jokin Mitxelena** and **Patxi**





Zubuzarreta will be at the Zentralbibliothek Bergen-Enkheim with an activity for children and young adults (19 October).

... and in other cities

Throughout October, events featuring Spanish authors have been or will be held in numerous other cities across Germany. For example, the **Instituto Cervantes Berlin** is hosting readings with **Berna González Harbour** (18 October) and **Sara Mesa** (28 October). **José F.A. Oliver** and **Mario Martín Gijón** will meet for a German and Spanish poetry reading at the **Bad Berleburg Literaturpflaster** (18 October). On 20 October, **Javier Cercas** will read from his latest novel published in German, *Independencia (Terra Alta 2)*, which will be followed by events with **Kiko Amat** (23 October) and **Miqui Otero** (27 October), as well as the opening of the exhibition *Illustrationen* (Illustrations) by **Marià Hesse** (24 October). And at this year's Literaturtagen in the Swiss city of Zofingen, the focus will also be on Spanish authors, starting with the poetic voice of Ibiza **Vicente Valero** on 29 October, followed by **Miqui Otero**, **Maria Sánchez** and **Elena Medel**, and **José Ovejero**. On 30 October, **María Castrejón, Sergio del Molino**, **Ray Loriga** and **Irene Solà** will take to the stage.





The Guest of Honour pavilion – the cherry theory

ENORME Studio Madrid designs the Guest of Honour pavilion

The concept

The design of Spain's Guest of Honour Pavilion is the work of Spanish architecture and design firm ENORME Studio, based in Madrid. The project is a collaboration between **ENORME Studio** and the interactive **design team Vitamin**, the narrative consultant Ignacio Vleming and **graphic design team twopoints**. The 'cherry theory' concept transforms the pavilion into a living dictionary that connects words, languages and stories together like a hypertext. The concept was inspired by the Spanish author Carmen Martín Gaite, who once said: "Stories are like cherries. When you pull on one, the next one comes with it."

The 'cherries' form the central element of the pavilion – three capsules that house an immersive exhibition, two stages, a happy-hour area and a space for workshops. They create places for listening and reading, for meeting people and relaxing, and for quiet contemplation. Interactive walls serve both as the backdrop for the pavilion and as a welcoming feature. Based on AI technology, this 'thermometer of ideas' is similar to the pages of a book, filling up with the words and ideas that are written over the course of the fair. Colourful dynamic graphics are used to reflect the creativity of Spanish culture and convey this concept to the pavilion's visitors. Other features include snaking bookshelves, a mechanical arm that holds a biro and reproduces the handwriting of some of Spain's leading authors, and a microphone that transforms words into splashes of colour according to the way they sound.

The designers

ENORME Studio is an architecture and design firm based in Madrid. Founded in 2016, it is managed by Carmelo Rodríguez and Rocío Pina. The studio is currently focusing on the designing and construction of ephemeral architecture whose social impact and innovation allows it to stand the test of time. ENORME is also engaged in urban projects and encourages proactive citizen participation. Examples of the studio's work have been shown at the Venice Architecture Biennale, the MOMA Museum of Modern Art and the Oslo Architecture Triennale 'After Belonging', winning them accolades such as the Mies van der Rohe European Award and the N.I.C.E. Award.

The Icíar Bollaín film series until 27 October 2022



Without a doubt, Icíar Bollaín is one of Spain's most prominent filmmakers. Born in Madrid in 1967, she first appeared in front of the camera at the tender age of 16, working for Victor Erice. After a number of other roles, Bollaín finally switched to directing in the 1990s. Since then, she has produced a total of ten long feature films,

which are characterised by both a masterful command of cinematic skill and a powerful commitment to the social cause. The DFF cinema is presenting a selection of her work, including the films *Flores De Otro Mundo* (Flowers from another World, 1999), *También la Lluvia* (Even the Rain, 2010), *El Olivo* (The Olive Tree, 2016) and *Maixabel* (2021).

Exhibition: Val del Omar: Cinema as an Element

until 27 October 2022



The multi-faceted Spanish filmmaker Val del Omar (1904–1982) can be described as a multimedia pioneer. His lifelong dream was cinema that appealed to all the senses. On 25 October, a lecture and film programme will provide insights into the director's work, focussing on his greatest cinematic accomplishment Tríptico Elemental de España. Then, on 26 October, his cinematic accomplishments will be

discussed in relation to international experimental films from the past and present during a lecture by filmmaker and curator Elena Duque.

Exhibition: Carlos Pérez Siquier until 15 January 2023



The Spanish photographer **Carlos Pérez Siquier** (1930–2021) was a leading figure in photographic Modernity and the professionalisation of Spanish photography. He had a prominent position on Spain's photographic scene, initially with his neorealist work and later as a pioneer of colour photography. In association with the Fundaçion MAPFRE, the Fotografie Forum Frankfurt is showing a retrospective of his most important series, dating from 1957 to 2018. The exhibition

will present unpublished photographs as well as documentary materials, which will help develop a new understanding of his work.

"Illustre Gestalten 15" illustration festival and exhibition 25–26 March 2023, Centralstation Darmstadt



Traditionally, the *Illustre Gestalten* illustration festival, which takes place six months after the book fair has closed, is dedicated to the most recent Guest of Honour. At the 15th edition of this festival, illustrators from Darmstadt will be presenting their latest works and adopting a new, diverse and impressive approach to demonstrate the

way they define their applied art. In this special exhibition on Spain, they will be turning their attention to the Guest of Honour of the Frankfurter Buchmesse. Naturally, the spotlight will





also be turned on illustrators from the guest country with the exhibition highlighting a selection of works from the best Spanish artists. The presentation and special exhibition will be supported by a diverse programme of events again, including a Graphic Recording Battle, performed live to a text about Spain, and a virtual exhibition that gives visitors the chance to meet other Spanish illustrators. A wide variety of illustrated pictures, products and books will be on sale, and the Comic Cosmos stand will be stocked with a range of graphic novels by Spanish artists.

Instituto Cervantes, Frankfurt

Literary encounter between Antonio Muñoz Molina and Luis García Montero 19 October 2022, 7.00 p.m.

Antonio Muñoz Molina is one of Spain's most important contemporary authors. He has published more than a dozen novels, some of which have been made into films and won numerous awards. As a member of the Royal Spanish Academy, the official institution for overseeing the Spanish language, he will be joined by Irene Vallejo to deliver the keynote speech at the opening of this year's Frankfurter Buchmesse. Luis García Montero, director of the Instituto Cervantes and professor of literature at the University of Granada, is one of Spain's most famous poets. and queer collages. His latest album, *La distancia entre el barro y la electrónica, 7 diferencias valdeomarianas* (which roughly translates as 'The distance between the mud and electronics, 7 valdeomarian differences') is dedicated to the great avant-garde artist José Val del Omar (1904–1982). These and numerous other references to multi-layered cultural traditions, combined with Contreras' stage presence, humour and unique voice, make the concert an extraordinary work of art.

José Ortiz Echagüe, born in Guadalajara in 1886 and died in Madrid in 1980, was a true multi-talent – an engineer, aircraft technician and pilot. In 1914, he became the first person to fly over the Strait of Gibraltar; in 1923, he founded the CASA aircraft manufacturer and in 1950 the car manufacturer SEAT – two of Spain's most successful large companies. At the same time, Ortiz Echagüe completed an indepth photographic project that was concerned with documenting Spanish culture, landscapes and architecture.

Flamenco: Fraskito Tierra y Sangre 20 October 2022, 8 p.m.



The self-taught guitarist Fraskito truly brings flamenco to life. As a young boy, he'd already decided that he wanted to express himself via the guitar – an instrument that he masters today with creative genius, enabling him to give new meaning to the flamenco genre. He writes that he wants to give us the opportunity to experience the magic of

his emotional world. He sees himself as a boy who strides into life, holding his guitar before him like a flag, and knows how much a song can impact the path someone's life can take. His album *Tierra y Sangre* is a tribute to the prominent Spanish poet and playwright Miguel Hernández (1910–1942), who was the son of a goatherd and followed in his father's footsteps to herd goats himself. Hernández developed his love for the great literature of the Spanish Baroque while at school, and his work *Viento del pueblo* (1937) led him to become a key poet in the Spanish fight for freedom.

Reading: Elvira Sastre. *Días sin ti* 21 October 2022, 8.00 p.m.



Elvira Sastre was born in Segovia in 1992. The poet and poetry slammer, who is very well-known in Spain, works with a wide range of artists and regularly performs to a full audience in Spanish theatres and concert halls. Her poetry collection *Adios al frío* (2020) put Sastre on the list of best-selling Spanish authors for several months. Her first novel, *Días sin ti*, is the tale of difficult love that the art lecturer Gael feels for the headstrong Marta, who poses as a

model for his students. His grandmother Dora tells him about her life during the Second Spanish Republic and the Civil War, and how, when she was working as a teacher, she fell in love with one of her pupils – something that could have caused quite a scandal. The author masterfully entwines the two narrative strands to transfer the scarred wounds from the Civil War onto his vivid depiction of the present. Read in German and Spanish. The book market in Spain is on the up

Germany ranks second among international target markets

With around 80,000 new titles, more than 174 million books sold, around 13 million downloads of e-books and a total turnover of approximately €2.5 billion in the past year, the Spanish publishing industry is the leading branch in Spain's cultural sector. On average, the publishing industry is estimated to represent almost 40% of the cultural and creative sector's contribution to GDP. The Spanish book industry thus constitutes a significant driver of growth for the country and is one of the leading book industries in the world. It is able to report further increases in a large number of areas.

During 2021, a total of 79,373 titles were (re)released (up 6.4% compared to the previous year), 55,197 of these titles being published in print (+8.9%) and 24,176 digitally (+1.2%). A total of 794,823 titles were available on the Spanish market in 2021 (+7.8%). This continues a trend that has been ongoing over the last five years: since 2016, this number has risen by more than 21%. Total turnover has also been on the up continuously for several years and in 2021 reached €2.5 billion, which represents an increase of 5.6% compared to the previous year. The number of printed copies also climbed impressively. In 2021, this amounted to 198.13 million books, a rise of 9.3% on 2020. The number of publishing houses also went up. In 2021, there were 778 active associated publishing companies belonging to one of the guilds or to one of the members of the association of publishers' guilds in Spain (+6.6%). The market is dominated by five major publishing houses including Grupo Planeta - the most important publishing group for Spain and Latin America - Penguin Random House and Santillana. However, with 3,000 independent publishing houses representing all genres - ranging from more commercial light fiction to accomplished literary works, and from the social sciences to poetry - the Spanish publishing sector is extremely diverse.

Translation grants are an important tool for the Guest of Honour project in order to promote the sale of rights of Spanish titles abroad. To this end, in 2019, the Ministry for Culture and Sport and the Acción Cultural Española (AC/E) launched a special programme for promoting translations. German plays an important part in this. In terms of the number of translations from Spanish, German lies in second place, after





Italian and ahead of English. Since 2019, more than $\notin 3$ million has been invested in supporting translations. This sum has risen continuously from $\notin 600,000$ at the beginning, to an annual amount of $\notin 850,000$ in the last two years. Ultimately, between 2019 and the end of 2022, more than 400 books will have been released onto the German-language market in connection with Spain's role as the Guest of Honour. In 2022 alone, 152 Spanish titles have already (or will) come onto the German market, 56 of which have received translation grants, representing a share of 37% of all new publications in German.
