From Frankfurt to the world: 72nd Frankfurter Buchmesse goes on the air with 260 hours of programming

More than 750 participants across all channels / Approximately 4,400 digital exhibitors from 103 countries / 2,100 events during the week of the fair / buchmesse.de serves as a digital showcase for the global book industry

The 72nd Frankfurter Buchmesse — this year's Special Edition — is making the international publishing industry's globe-spanning network visible: The exhibitor directory — an industry catalogue that currently has almost 4,400 entries — includes publishers, literary agents and service providers from over 100 countries. The largest contingent comprises players from the German-speaking world — 1,283 digital exhibitors from Germany, Switzerland (104) and Austria (90) — followed by the UK (418), the US (332), Canada and China (126 each), France (116) and Brazil (67). Smaller territories and countries with less extensive book markets can also be found in the directory, e.g. publishers and organisations from Albania, Brunei, Iraq, Cameroon, Nepal and many other nations.

"Frankfurter Buchmesse brings together people from all continents who are committed to spreading the world and making knowledge accessible. This year, the pandemic forced us to rethink our approach: Although it will not be possible to use the exhibition halls to present publishers' catalogues and new technologies, we wanted to facilitate interactions and an exchange among industry professionals, even if this will happen primarily via digital means. One of Frankfurter Buchmesse's main tasks is to offer a forum for social and political discourse and make it possible to experience the many voices engaged in literary storytelling. While digital venues cannot replace face-to-face meetings, they can enable communication across thousands of kilometres. Tradition-rich and self-assured, the book and publishing industry has positioned itself more broadly using digital technology — and has become more accessible as a result. That is, for me, a strong signal of hope," said Juergen Boos at the opening press conference in Frankfurt's Festhalle.

Karin Schmidt-Friderichs, chairwoman of the German Publishers & Booksellers Association, called for the industry to continue investing in the future: "Books are crisis-proof and an indispensable part of society. But the competing media are not standing idly by, and the way people live, buy and read is changing. Bookshops and

publishing houses are working on new ways to generate enthusiasm for books, now and in the future. In addition to those efforts, we should combine the enhanced digital skills developed during the corona pandemic with our traditional expertise. We will continue, moreover, to work at making books more visible and ensuring children and young people learn to read in all possible contexts."

"Every October during the book fair, the literary world looks to the metropolis on the Main and to Hesse. We are cosmopolitan, international, located in the heart of Europe and, thus, exactly the right place for a fair dedicated to free thought and free speech. This year, unfortunately, the corona pandemic has not left the fair and publishers unaffected. All of us would have liked to see more publishers, exhibitors and visitors physically present in Frankfurt, not least because the city and its fairgrounds are one of the largest marketplaces for book publishing. Instead of taking place as a traditional exhibition, the fair is being held as a 'Special Edition'—not only in Frankfurt, but, above all, digitally. I can only recommend having a look at the website listing the fair's events. We in Hesse are proud that one of the world's most important trade fairs for literary endeavours is located in our home state. I wish the world's publishing houses all the best for the future. To all the fair's visitors, whether digital or physically present on site: I hope your days here are as exciting as they are insightful," said Volker Bouffier, minister president of the state of Hesse.

The main platform for the events at the Frankfurter Buchmesse — Special Edition is the ARD Book Fair Stage in the Festhalle. That is where some 60 happenings will take place during all five days of the fair — without a live audience, due to the increasing number of Covid-19 cases in Frankfurt and throughout Germany. All events are being streamed at www.buchmesse.de/live and www.buchmesse.de.ard.de.

Managing director of Hessischer Rundfunk, Manfred Krupp, emphasised: "Books as a medium are incredibly diverse. I am very pleased that in this challenging year we are a partner to Frankfurter Buchmesse and are organising ARD's offerings. We will be reaching out to our audience in a variety of ways, including through the multifaceted programme taking place on the ARD stage, through the website buchmesse.ard.de and through our wide-ranging reportage on radio and television. We are covering the full range of societal debates by offering a platform for the relevant discourse."

Sustainability, diversity, inclusion — those are issues Lydia Hilebrand, co-founder of Munich-based publishing house & Töchter, is passionate about. The book fair's opening press conference allowed the young publisher to present her views: "It is high time to act responsibly. We want to set ecological standards, which is why we have our books produced using methods that are as climate friendly as possible. We want to open the world of literature to everyone and show even non-readers that reading is more than just a boring subject from school. We are not merely a new

publishing house that wants a piece of the pie. We want to work with everyone to bake bigger, more colourful pies."

Literary inspiration and exciting interactions – BOOKFEST programme lets the Special Edition shine, digitally and on site

Live: talk with Edward Snowden | German Book Prize nominee Bov Bjerg in the city

Every October, culture fans celebrate together at BOOKFEST. This year, the popular festival will take place physically as BOOKFEST city and, for the first time, virtually as BOOKFEST digital — allowing an even bigger and more colourful celebration of stars from the international cultural and literary scene. BOOKFEST city $(14-18\ {\rm October})$ will offer almost 80 events over all five days of the fair at many locations throughout Frankfurt. BOOKFEST digital will light up screens on 17 October beginning from 09.30 pm, with approximately 28 hours of highly diverse programming on two channels.

BOOKFEST digital: with Elizabeth Gilbert, Matt Haig, Edward Snowden, Margaret Atwood, among others

Following the call for participation, 812 submissions were received from 500 publishing houses in 50 countries. A total of 150 entries from 80 publishers in 30 countries were ultimately selected for BOOKFEST digital. Viewers can expect a mixture of topics, including entertainment, thrillers, science, lifestyle, gourmet cooking, travel, works for children and young adults, illustrations, and much more.

Edward Snowden risked everything to expose the system of mass surveillance by the US government. At BOOKFEST digital he will tell his story. Margaret Atwood, one of the most important storytellers of our time, will talk about her literary work. Jamie Oliver will show how his new book is created. Matt Haig will talk about his most recent novel *The Midnight Library*. In a video recorded at her home in New Jersey, bestselling author Elizabeth Gilbert will discuss her writing, including her current book *City of Girls*. The young and innovative arts project istanbulberlin will create an intercultural bridge between both pulsating metropolises with, among others, artists, activists and authors Ulrich Gutmair, Şebnem İşigüzel, Burhan Sönmez, Ayfer Tunc, and Yasemin Mori. Essayist Eliot Weinberger will provide incisive commentary on the current situation in the US prior to the elections there. Ayad Akhtar, the most-performed playwright in the US today, will talk about his second book *Homeland Elegies*. The event *She Said: Breaking the Sexual Harassment Story That Helped Ignite a Movement* will tell the unique and inspiring story of the *New York Times* journalists Megan Twohey and Jodi Kantor,

who broke the story of sexual harassment involving Harvey Weinstein and others. And one of Africa's most important literary voices, Yvonne Adhiambo Owuor, will speak with Bärbel Schäfer.

BOOKFEST city - with German Book Prize nominee Bov Bjerg

Bov Bjerg, who has been nominated for the German Book Prize, will put in an appearance at BOOKFEST city: He will read from his novel *Serpentinen* (Serpentines). Juan Tomás Ávila Laurel is one of central Africa's most honoured writers. A refugee in Spain since fleeing Equatorial Guinea in 2011, he is one of the most prominent voices speaking out against the regime of Teodoro Obiang. The film *The Writer from a Country Without Bookstores* (82 minutes) will be shown, documenting Ávila Laurel's journey from Spain back to his native country. The event "Wavelengths of Your Song" will be a mixture of reading and talk with Canadian author Eleonore Schönmaier. Writer, translator and publisher Adrian Kasnitz will speak with the prizewinning poet about her complex verse.

They'll discuss current challenges and new opportunities resulting from the coronavirus outbreak, as well as their expectations for the book business in the coming months. Other key speakers appearing at Publishing Insights include Jenny Fry, Commercial Director at Canongate (UK), and Simon de Jocas, President and Owner of the children's publishing house Éditions Les 400 coups (Canada).

LiBeraturpreis 2020: Lina Atfah

The LiBeraturpreis is awarded annually by Litprom e.V. to a female author from Africa, Asia, Latin America or the Arab world. The recipient is chosen by a public online vote, and in 2020 the award goes to Lina Atfah, a refugee who left Syria in 2014 and who has lived in Germany since. Born in 1989, the author is the first to be honoured for a volume of poetry: Das Buch von der fehlenden Ankunft (The Book of the Missing Arrival, German translation by Suleman Taufiq, among others, published by Pendragon Verlag in 2019). The award ceremony will be broadcast on Thursday, 15 October, at 7.30 pm on the Litprom e.V. YouTube channel. The presentation speech will be given by poet Safiye Can. On Friday, 16 October, at 1 pm, Lina Atfah will appear on the ARD Book Fair Stage in the Festhalle in conversation with poet Jan Wagner, who contributed to the interlinear translations of her work. The 2020 LiBeraturpreis is being supported by the city of Frankfurt's Department of Science and Culture and its Department for Women. The award ceremony was recorded in Villa 102, the cultural platform of KfW Stiftung.

African Perspectives – Writers and Literary Experts in Conversation

Litprom e.V. is celebrating an anniversary this year: It all began with a topical focus on sub-Saharan Africa at the 1980 Frankfurter Buchmesse. 40 years later, it's time to take a fresh look at the literatures from this region. KfW Stiftung and Litprom are jointly organising a symposium on African literatures and their rendering in the German-speaking world: "African Perspectives — Writers and Literary Experts in Conversation". In 2020, Frankfurter Buchmesse (Special Edition from 14-18 October 2020) is championing the principles of optimism and solidarity: the virtual platform Signals of Hope is designed to promote discussions that are needed this year more urgently than ever. "In the midst of a culture of outrage, pessimism and conspiracy theories, we want to send a signal of hope by providing a stage for social leaders and literary figures," explains Katja Böhne, head of Marketing & Communication at Frankfurter Buchmesse. The main issues will be human rights, gender diversity, feminism, structural racism and climate change. Each day will be dedicated to a different topic:

- * Day 2 (15 October 2020): Hope is Diverse
- * Day 3 (16 October 2020): Hope and Action
- * Day 4 (17 October 2020): Climate of Hope
- * Day 5 (18 October 2020): Hope for Tomorrow
