Salah Naoura studied German and Scandanavian literature in Berlin and Stockholm. He lives and works as a free-lance author and translator in Berlin (for Julia Donaldson and Frank Cottrell Boyce, among others). His work has won numerous awards. Matti and Sami and the Greatest Mistakes of the Universe was awarded the Peter Härtling Prize and the annual LUCHS (Lynx) by Die Zeit, and was also nominated for the German Youth Literature Prize.

Yet it is the basis of our lives: it filters and stores water and is home to raw materials and countless creatures – there are even wars fought over it. This comprehensive and vividly illustrated book explains to children why the soil is so important for climate protection and biodiversity, and shows that we need it to survive.

Karolin Küntzel has written numerous non-fiction books for adults and children.

She also writes narrative children's books and runs a blog about nature.

Barbara Schulze Frenking lives and works in Munich. After studying design with a focus on illustration and infographics, she became a freelance illustrator in 2022. She wants her illustrations to make people smile and think, and to make the world a little bit more colourful.

We encounter it not only when we look at the stars in the night sky, but also when we think about time, number sequences, sourdough, quantities, the immortality of the soul, snowflakes... and cheese!

A book with lots of answers and new questions for further reflection.

In no time at all, the rights to *Starman*, the first book on David Bowie's early years, were sold into 10 languages, and German critics couldn't praise it enough: "Indeed, this text feels like a concert." (*Welt am Sonntag Kompakt*); "The story is superbly drawn, the colours pop. [...] Outstanding!" (*Hamburger Morgenpost*).

Now, the long-awaited sequel is here. LOW looks at David Bowie's years in West Berlin, during his search for inspiration and the start of work on his album Low.

Since 1996 Reinhard Kleist has been living in Berlin where he shares his studio with other comic book artists. His comic books have won several awards including the Max and Moritz Award, the most prestigious prize for German comic books.

Hats and Other Headwear From All Over the World

This masterfully illustrated picture book is a unique cultural history of hats. Using hats as examples, it shows how diverse our world is. Because hats and head coverings can be attractive and eye-catching, but they can also achieve the exact opposite by making their wearers invisible, in a sense, protecting them from stares.

The book's subject is vibrantly portrayed: one hat is presented across from the next in single-page layouts, followed by double-paged, alternating throughout. Numerous detailed close-

ups help the focus and flow. Hats off!

Hats is Karen Exner's first (and hopefully not last) picture book with Carlsen.

She makes fun of dragons, man-eating lizards and monsters with several heads. There's nothing that spooks her. Until she thinks up a story that has Boris quaking in his boots.

Nikolaus Heidelbach was born in 1955 and is regarded as one of Germany's best contemporary illustrators. His picture books have won many awards, including the Special Prize of the German Youth Literature Award.

Ole Könnecke, born in 1961, lives in Hamburg. He has designed 30 books, for which he has won several national and international awards.

Of course, little kids are afraid of some things. In Nele, Adam and Zaima's case, it's hearing aids and loud snoring. But would they run away during a thunderstorm or when they see a black cat? That only makes fear bigger, they think. And so they decide to creep up on fear and pinch its tummy instead. That way they don't just get rid of their own fright but also that of some of the adults.

Sybille Hein, born in 1970, studied philosophy (halfway through) and illustration (to the end) and has toured throughout Germany as a revue performer. Now she lives with her family in Berlin. She is an author and writes radio plays, satire and subversive songs.

A man wants to go to Africa. How nice! say his eyes, ears, nose, neck, tummy, head, heart – and his right hand. But his left hand wants to stay at home and holds on tight to the radiator.

A madcap, poetic and very funny story about the love of staying at home and

the love of travelling, the contradictions in us all and the mystery of being human.
